

# 104: Chemotherapy Intent (Curative vs Non-Curative) Documented Before or Within Two Weeks After Administration



## What is this measure?

- Curative intent chemotherapy - purpose of treatment is to cure
- Non-curative intent chemotherapy - purpose of treatment is to palliate symptoms, prolong life, or prevent development of new symptoms

## Why is this measure important?

- Helps **communicate** treatment intent between team members
- May help clinicians **communicate** with patients and families
- Relates to additional MOQC Measure on granulocyte colony stimulating factor

## What is included in this measure?

### Med Onc Patients:

- Chemotherapy was administered during their initial treatment course
- Chemotherapy intent documented within 60 days prior or 14 days after chemotherapy was given

### Gyn Onc Patients:

- Patient received chemotherapy for diagnosis
- Chemotherapy intent documented within 60 days prior or 14 days after chemotherapy was given
